## TALLY-HO!

Caufman Tally Wins Event 7 at IP Following Two and a Half Hour Final Table.

Biloxi, MS (November 2, 2011) — Six-Handed No Limit Hold'em is a favorite among poker enthusiasts. Some like the increased skill required, some prefer the fast-paced play and others just enjoy having more room at the table. But one thing everybody loves is the action!

Because tables play six-handed as opposed to nine or 10-handed, play moves much faster and players see more hands and get involved in more pots. Ring Event 7 at IP Resort Casino and Spa in Biloxi, Mississippi represents exhibit A of this theory.

The final table was trimmed down to the remaining two players only an hour and forty minutes after the start of play. The most recent WSOPC champion is Caufman Talley. Talley is a 21-year-old professional poker player from Lafayette, Louisiana. This marks one of his larger poker scores and his first WSOPC ring.

Talley began Day 2 of the No-Limit Hold'em Six-Handed tournament with over 680,000 chips and the blinds and antes at 3,000/6,000 and 1,000. Play began promptly at 3 p.m. CST with seven players remaining. One hour and forty minutes later, we were heads-up.

197 players put up the \$345 buy-in to play in Event 7 at the IP. The \$57,327 prize pool paid the top 21 finishers.

Notable finishers includes three-time Circuit champion, Tim Burt (21<sup>st</sup>), Horseshoe Southern Indiana Event 7 Champion, Ben Kramer (19<sup>th</sup>) and 19-time Circuit casher, Peter Mavro (18<sup>th</sup>).

Mark Rose left the tournament in seventh place. He has now recorded two cashes at IP Casino. His other came in Event 1, a \$345 No-Limit Hold'em Ring Event when he finished sixth. Rose's seventh place finish in Event 7 was one spot short of making the official final table of six and his second final table at the IP. He earned \$2,091.

With his elimination, the final table was set.
