Turbo No-Limit Championship Goes to Troy Declue

Wildomar, CA Man Wins First WSOP Circuit Gold Ring at Lake Tahoe

WSOP Circuit Events at Harvey's Lake Tahoe Continue through Nov. 21st

Stateline, NV (**November 17, 2011**) – Troy Declue, from Wildomar, CA won his first-ever World Series of Poker Circuit gold ring with a victory on the Turbo No-Nk o kv" J qnføg o "vqwtpc o gpv0""Vj g"qpg-day event y cu" j gnf "cv" J ctxg {øu"Ncmg"Vc j qg0""

Declue collected \$13,724 and the WSOP Circuit gold ring. This was his first-ever WSOP Circuit cash. His victory was shown on a live streaming broadcast at WSOP.com.

The runner up was Jeff Rowland, from Indianapolis, IN. He received the mixed blessing of a second-place payout, worth \$8,476.

The third-place finisher was Manuel Lozano, from Santa Monica, CA. He owns a music school. Lozano has several cashes in smaller tournaments. This was his best showing in a WSOP-related tournament. Third place paid \$6,120.

With his victory, Declue joins the eight other previous champions who now have gold rings at the 2011 Lake Tahoe series:

Event #1: David Clark (Dallas, TX) defeated 260 players and won \$18,208

Event #2: Josh Roberts (Jackson, CA) defeated 521 players and won \$32,300

Event #3: Mark Bonsack (Maple Valley, CA) defeated 85 players and won \$7,484

Event #4: Michael Rosenbach (San Francisco, CA) defeated 101 players and won \$13,874

Event #5: Daniel Aran (San Jose, CA) defeated 188 players and won \$13,874

Event #6: Rudy Sisson (Sacramento, CA) defeated 221 players and won \$15,741

Event #7: Nick Long (South Lake Tahoe, CA) defeated 199 players and won \$57,909

Event #8: Alexandru Masek (San Diego, CA) defeated 206 players and won \$15,236

Event #9: Troy Declue (Wildomar, CA) defeated 186 players and won \$13,724

Three-quarters of this WSOP Circuit stop is now complete. Through the first nine events, Michael Rosenbach (San Francisco, CA) remains as the leader in the YUQR"Ektewkvøu"õDguv"Cm-Ctqwpf"Rnc{gtö" standings for Lake Tahoe. His lead comes from two final table appearances so far ó including a fifth and a first-place showing. However, several other players are within striking distance entering the final weekend of tournaments.

The player who accumulates thg" o quv"qxgtcm"rqkpvu"kp"Ncmg"Vcjqgøu"vygnxg"eq o dkpgf"gold ring tournaments receives a pre-paid entry into the \$1 million 2011-2012 WSOP Circuit National Championship, to be held in Las Vegas, next May. At least two players from this tournament series will qualify for the WSOP Circuit National Championship, which is classified as a WSOP gold bracelet event.
