Bombs Away! Chris "BiloxiBomber" Conrad Wins PLO Event at Harrah's Tunica

Defeats good friend, Michael "Carwash" Schneider heads up to claim his first WSOPC Gold Ring

TUNICA, MS – "You know, I'm tired of everybody giving me crap about not having a ring!" Chris Conrad announced to the rail as he sat down to heads up play.

Clearly, somebody had a huge monkey on his back.

After numerous WSOP Circuit Final Tables, seven to be exact, Conrad was as close as ever to finally owning a piece of WSOPC hardware. There was only caveat to him sealing the win. He had to do so at the expense of close friend, Michael "Carwash" Schneider.

From the tone of the two players, it was clear that this Circuit Event finale would be much different than others.

"It was a bit weird playing him heads up," said Conrad after the win.

Schneider concurred. "I didn't have fun heads up. It wasn't fun to lose a pot, but also taking a pot from Chris also wasn't so fun."

By virtue, poker players are in the business of taking each other's money, but despite this, many strong bonds are formed among them. While it's often business as usual even between good friends, it was clear that Conrad and Schneider shared a strong mutual sense of admiration and respect.

However, Schneider, who had finished as the runner up in four previous major PLO events, had his own monkey to shake off, so the two players cast aside everything personal and got to business.

After a three-hour heads up battle, "BiloxiBomber" had come out on top. The two started nearly even in chips, but after taking a huge pot, Conrad kept Schneider at bay with a 3-1 lead and was able to close it out shortly after midnight. For the win, Conrad was awarded \$13,122 and his first WSOP Circuit Gold Ring.

"It feels good. I was tired of everybody telling me I didn't have a ring," Conrad said after the win. "It was fun, but it wasn't. I wished Schneider could get the win but I had to do my thing."

Event #8, \$365 Pot-Limit Omaha drew 162 entries for a total prize pool of \$48,600. Play for the day ended once the final 16 were in the money and after less than an hour on day two, were down to the final table.

Final table play was steady as each of the final players fell one by one. Doug "Rico" Carli extended his streak of all-time most cashes with a tenth place finish while local poker room manager, Jake Bush was the third place finisher.

With the win, Conrad also picked up 50 points toward the Casino Champion points race at Harrah's Tunica, while he is a long shot to overtake the current points leader here at Tunica, John Holley, he now has a total of 142.5 points toward his at-large bid for one of the 60 National Championships seats to be awarded in May.

Haven finally gotten over the Circuit gold ring hump, "BiloxiBomber" gave fair warning to those players at the top of the ring leader race.

"I'm coming after Kyle Cartwright and Alex Masek,"

"Someday, maybe."
