The Canadian domination continued today at the World Series of Poker, as Calen McNeil of British Columbia won the sixth bracelet for the country in the \$1,500 Omaha Hi-Low event as well as \$277,274.

This event went into an unscheduled fourth day of play after a long stretch of final table action on Day 3, then continued for two and a half more hours today. The heads-up battle between McNeil and Can Kim Hua was a tough one, as neither player was willing to go out without a fight.

Fighting is something McNeil is familiar with as he possesses a black belt in karate. He is also familiar with overcoming adversity. Back in 1994, McNeil suffered an overdose while in the hospital and he went into a coma for five days. He managed to pull through that scary time. Now, almost twenty years later, he fought and won a much happier battle.
