Daniel Idema surpassed the \$1 million mark in career earnings at the WSOP with a victory in the \$1,500 Seven Card Stud Hi-Low Split-8 or Better tournament. The event concluded during the early morning hours of Monday and Idema earned his second gold bracelet in addition to \$184,590 in prize money.

Like Justin Oliver hours before him, Idema extended Canada's record for the most cashes for a non-U.S. country in a series, bringing the total to nine wins through just 39 events. The previous record of seven was set just a few weeks ago, but the Canadians kept rolling, locking up more two wins since then.

Idema is a 28-year-old former hockey player turned poker pro from Vancouver, BC. His Event 39 win marks his 19th WSOP cash, fifth final table appearance and second victory.
