Daniel Alaei won his fourth gold bracelet at the 44th Annual World Series of Poker following a grueling Day 3 that stretched into the early morning hours of Monday. The victory came in a \$10,000 Pot-Limit Omaha event, the same event Alaei won in 2010, and skyrockets Alaei's WSOP earnings passed the \$3.5 million dollar mark.

With four bracelets, Alaei is now in elite company that includes Puggy Pearson, Amarillo Slim and Bobby Baldwin. Additionally, he joins 2007 WSOP Player of the Year Tom Schneider as the second player to earn his fourth gold bracelet at the 2013 WSOP.

The most recent WSOP winner was crowned at the expense of high-stakes online pro Jared Bleznick. Bleznick is a well-established as an internet player, but the \$526,692 score marks his largest live payday and first WSOP final table.
