**No Wedding Bell Blues for Ben Grise
Indianapolis, IN native wins his first ring in the Six-Max event.**

Elizabeth, IN (October 8, 2013) – It has been quite the summer for Eric Fields. First, the 22-year from Greensboro, NC graduated from the University of Alabama with a degree in Business. Just a few weeks after, he travels to New Orleans and won his first WSOP Circuit ring in only his fourth-ever tournament.

Since then, Fields has been playing full-time. Mainly a cash game player, Fields does play in some tournaments. Yesterday, he parlayed his Pot-Limit Omaha cash game skills into his second Circuit ring.

There were only 49 total entrants in the \$365 Pot-Limit Omaha with Rebuys event at the Horseshoe Southern Indiana. However, there were so many rebuys that it boosted the prize pool to \$35,800. Originally scheduled for a two-day event, the action was so fast that the tournament completed in just one day.

Just nine hours into the tournament, the final five players had reached the money. Patty Till, who had finished fourth in the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em Six-Handed event earlier in the day, was among them. Till, who won the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em Turbo just a few days prior, ended up finishing fourth for the second time in one day. She took home \$4,479 for her finish and added another 27.5 points to her Casino Champion points lead.

After the elimination of Till, it took Fields less than an hour to finish off his last two opponents. For his victory, Fields pocketed \$13,425 and his second WSOP Circuit ring.

Fields now has two career WSOP Circuit cashes and they are both victories.

Notes on the Event

- This was scheduled for a two-day event but completed in just one.
- Patty Till now holds the Casino Champion points lead with 105 points.

With his victory, Fields earns 50 points towards the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Casino Champion standings. Patty Till continues to lead the contest with an impressive 105 points. The player who accumulates the most overall points in Horseshoe Southern Indiana's twelve combined gold ring tournaments earns the title Casino Champion and receives an automatic entry into the 2013-2014 WSOP National Championship, as will the winner of the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Main Event. All players who cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Champion race and the season-long race to claim one of the at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season. With the seventh tournament now wrapped up, there are still five more gold ring events remaining as the WSOP Circuit at Horseshoe Southern Indiana continues through October 14th.
