Tommy Burleson Stands Taller than the Field NBA veteran wins the final event at Horseshoe Southern Indiana.

Elizabeth, IN (October 14, 2013) – When Tommy Burleson and his son, David, decided to make the six-hour trek to the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Circuit from Newland, NC, they didn't have much time. In fact, the final event in the series was the only one that they would be able to play. They made the most of it though, as the elder Burleson bested the 116 player field in the \$365 No-Limit Hold 'em event.

While David was knocked out of the event in the first 30 minutes of play, his father went on to end Day 1 fifth in chips at the final table. Today, play lasted just over three hours and Burleson was able to overcome a big lead of Nathan Burgess to earn his first Circuit ring.

Tommy Burleson is quite the story. Standing over seven feet tall, this 61-year old has had quite the life so far. He was a part of the famed 1972 Olympic Men's Basketball team and also a part of the 1974 N.C. State National Championship team. He then went on to play in the NBA from 1974 until 1981 for such teams as Seattle, Kansas City and Atlanta.

Since then, the father of three sons has moved on to do much more. Once or twice a year, Burleson goes on mission trips to Africa to help those less fortunate. He even mentioned that a portion of his winnings would be going to that cause.

While Burleson may not be a regular on the WSOP Circuit, he is one of the best stories we will ever come across. In only the third Circuit event he has ever played, Burleson has joined the rank of those who own a WSOP Circuit ring.

Notes on the Event

- The final table took just over three hours to complete.
- This was Tommy Burleson's first Circuit ring in only his third event.
- Patty Till wins the Casino Champion title with a total of 120 points.

With the 12th and final ring event of the series in the books, patty Till can now officially claim the honor of Casino Champion. She managed to amass an impressive 120 points across five cashes, including winning her second ring. As a result, she can now punch her ticket to the season-ending WSOP National Championship in Atlantic City along with Horseshoe Southern Indiana Main Event winner Zal Irani. All players who cash in ring events will receive points that apply to both the Casino Champion race and the season-long race to claim one of the at-large National Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season.
