## **Janchiv Enkhyam Wins First Gold Ring**

**Unlikely victor emerges following back-to-back to double ups.**

**Hammond, IN (October 22, 2013)** — The rail thought Janchiv Enkhyam was kidding when he mentioned waiting to play a hand until his favorite dealer got back in the box.

“You’ve got six minutes,” the current dealer said looking at his watch.

In fairness, he was kidding. He splashed around in some small pots, but definitely didn’t make any big moves until his favorite dealer took her seat.

Fast forward six minutes.

Tiffanie got in the box and proceeded to double Enkhyam up on her first hand back. A few hands later, she doubled him up again. A few hands later, he was a gold ring winner.

“I was behind the big pair of [James Notier heads up], but [Tiffanie] gave me a set on the turn. That’s why I like her,” Enkhyam said.

Enkhyam began the final table toward the middle of the chip counts with 416,000 but was leaps and bounds behind the 1,339,000 chips of the leader Michael Lee. It wasn’t in the cards for Lee, though, as he exited the tournament 4th. Next went hometown grinder Anthony Sansone in 3rd and finally James Nortier in 2nd.

Enkhyam earned \$30,250 as well as his first gold ring for the performance in the \$365 No-Limit Hold'em tournament.

Enkhyam is a 35-year-old truck driver who resides in Mount Prospect, IL. He came to the United States from Mongolia 20 years ago to pursue the American dream. If one didn’t know any better, it seems he’s achieved that and then some.

“When I played this tournament, it wasn’t for the money. I wasn’t trying to make money, I just wanted to win because \$30,000 doesn’t mean a lot to me,” Enkhyam said.
