All eyes were on the defending champion in the \$1,500 buy-in Omaha Hi-Lo Split event at the start of the third and final day of competition at the Rio in Las Vegas. It appeared that Calen McNeil, the flamboyant Canadian champion from last year, might pull of the unthinkable feat of winning back-to-back titles. However, Nicholas Kost had a different script in mind and wrote his own storybook ending.

McNeil ended up finishing fourth in a wild final table that ended at 2 am on a Friday night, in front of a gallery of supporters and spectators. His conqueror, Kost, caught a flurry of high fives as he came from behind in the chip count and managed to win his first career WSOP gold bracelet against some formidable competition. That made the victory all the more sweet for the engineer and oil pipeline worker originally from Michigan, now living in Chicago. First place paid \$283,275.
