Steven Curran Wins Ring in \$365 Turbo No Limit Hold'em

46-year-old project manager earns first ring in the series' only turbo event.

Los Angeles, CA. (December 11, 2015) — Steven Curran is by no means a professional poker player, but he played like one on Thursday night. He defeated Massoud Eskandari heads-up to win his first ring and \$10,810 in the \$365 Turbo No Limit Hold'em.

Curran is married with a full-time job as a project manager for Transamerica. He admits that with a family and a job, poker doesn't always get to come first on his list of things to do.

"I try and play once a week," said Curran. "Whenever my wife lets me out. I like to try to play as much as I can."

This is Curran's first significant tournament win of his poker career. Before this, his most notable poker accomplishment was earning a cash in the 2010 WSOP Main Event.

"It's great," he said. "I got very lucky. I was short-stacked a couple times, doubled up a couple times and found a way to get to the end."

When he got to the end, there was one big obstacle that was standing between Curran and his first ring – Massoud Eskandari. Eskandari is a Los Angeles tournament regular with over \$1 million in tournament earnings, including a runner-up finish at the WPT Legends of Poker main event in 2014.

Curran didn't seem phased by what was in his way and sent Eskandari to the rail in just a few hands.

"It was definitely a tough table with some really good players," said Curran of the talent at the final table. "But I got some cards at the end and then held on."

Along with his win, Curran is vaulted into an eight-way tie for third place in the Casino Championship race by earning 50 points. Wendy Freedman currently leads with 75 points and Alan Myerson is on her heels with 60 points. Myerson is the only player at this stop to have multiple cashes and win a ring. Curran is tied with the seven other players who have won a ring.

The winner of that title, along with the winner of the main event earns an automatic bid into the Global Casino Championship (previously called the National Championship).

This is the ninth of 12 gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at the Bicycle Casino. The \$365 Turbo No Limit Hold'em attracted 120 players. The total prize pool came to \$36,000. The top 12 finishers were paid.

The tournament began on Thursday, December 10 at 3 p.m. and the unofficial final table of 10 players was reached at just before midnight. The final card was dealt just before 3 a.m., making the total duration of the finale table about 3 hours.
