## **Steve Dill Conquers The Monster Stack**

**Tunica, Mississippi (January 27, 2017)** – The World Series of Poker Circuit stop at Horseshoe Tunica has crowned another winner. Steve Dill, from Fenton, Missouri, conquered a sizable field of 592 entrants in Event #9: \$365 No-Limit Hold'em Monster Stack One Re-Entry to win his first gold ring and \$37,290.

Dill does not identify as a full-time poker player, but hits the felt when he can. The 41-year-old owns a car dealership that specializes in pre-owned commercial vehicles, which does occasionally open the door for him to pursue poker.

"It gives me some flexibility. I hired a salesperson this month... So it gives me the opportunity to get away and do this," explained Dill. "And hopefully I can get away and do it more."

Judging by his recent achievement, Dill certainly could be inclined to enter more Circuit events. Unfortunately for Dill, the WSOPC has not come through St. Louis, since 2012. "I use to play more when it came to my hometown," said Dill.

There are still some Circuit stops within reasonable driving range for the Missouri native though, including Tunica of course. Dill made the trip south with a couple of friends, all hoping for financial gain, enough to extend their stay.

"Three of us drove down on Tuesday night, planning to play this event. If this didn't work out, we were going to play the \$580. Either one of those worked out we were going to play the Main," Dill explained. "We got rooms through the weekend just in case."

The extra hotel nights will come in handy because it seems the trio is Main Event bound thanks to Dill's Monster Stack success. The signature, WSOP tournament begins tomorrow at 11:00 am with Flight A. However, Dill mentioned he may opt for Flight B on Saturday after having just played two strenuous days of poker.

Even though it was a long Day 1, and the Monster Stack's inflated chip piles were sure to make for an extensive Day 2, Dill was well prepared for the final leg of the event.

"You know what, I had my backpack full of snacks and I actually got a pretty decent night's sleep last night," Dill stated. "The late start helped out too."

Dill began Day 2 ranked 28<sup>th</sup> out of a field of 32 remaining players. This was the polar opposite of his eventual heads-up opponent, Chun Law who advanced as the overall chip leader. It did not discourage Dill though. He hung in, made a push to the final table, then, after a grueling duel with Law, scooped the last pot of the tournament and walked away a champion.

Event #9 was the ninth of 12 gold ring events on the WSOP Circuit schedule at the Horseshoe Tunica series. The \$365 No-Limit Hold'em Monster Stack One Re-Entry tournament attracted 592 players generating a \$177,600 prizepool. The top 63 players were paid.

The player who accumulates the most overall points during the Circuits twelve combined gold ring events earns the title of Casino Champion and receives automatic entry into the WSOP Global Casino Championship set to take place at the end of the season.

All players who cash in ring events receive points that apply toward the Casino Championship race and the season-long race to claim one of 50 at-large Global Casino Championship bids awarded to the top point earners throughout the season.
