DAVE POTTER CLAIMS 1ST GOLD RING

Local rec player achieves Circuit gold after long absence in WSOP results.

Dave Potter claimed his first Circuit gold ring on Monday, after a spell of absence in the World Series of Poker results. The Kentucky native defeated a field of 146 players in Event #4: \$400 No-Limit Hold'em Big Blind Ante, a tournament that took two days to complete at the Horseshoe Southern Indiana Circuit stop.

Potter is a local, recreational player who frequents "The Boat" about two days a week, usually accompanied by his wife, who he gives the upper to.

"She's actually the better poker player," Potter admitted. "If I'm on the rail watching her play, they give me a hard time."

It has been some time since his last WSOP recording though. Potter's most recent cash on the Circuit tour was a 3rd-place showing worth \$4,723, which came in 2009 at the S. Indiana series.

Nine years later and the 62-year-old found his way into the winner's circle. Potter also earned himself a payout of \$13,490 and 50 Casino Championship points for his 1st-place achievement, along with the golden hardware.
