Cincinnati, Ohio native rides chip lead and run good to victory.

Daniel Statman caught some run good at the World Series of Poker Circuit series in Cherokee, North Carolina. The 53-year-old topped a field of 539 entrants in Event #4: \$400 No-Limit Hold'em Six Max to win his first gold ring and \$39,128.

The tournament took two days to reach a conclusion at the Harrah's Cherokee Event Center. After Day 1, Statman was in control of the overall chip lead. He retained that position throughout Day 2 as well.

Following the redraw to an unofficial final table, play began to heavily stall. Only one player was knocked out in a matter of four levels. However, things finally began to give, the final table dwindled, and heads up was a whole different story.

Four-time gold ring winner Marshall White went out in 3rd place, leaving Statman and Dennis Wood to battle for the ring. It was a short faceoff though. Two hands in a row, Statman managed to hit trips after being behind when the two players got it all in.

Statman is a semi-retiree from Cincinnati, Ohio who plays in a good amount of poker tournaments and frequents the Cherokee Circuits when they run. He now has 50 Casino Championship points and will be here for the rest of the series.
