MARVIN GUSS WINS FINAL EVENT AT HAMMOND

Guss missed the whole series but capitalized on the final event to make first ever final table and win first ring.

The WSOP Circuit at Horseshoe Hammond saw many players take several shots at trying to win gold but not Marvin Guss. Guss showed up on the last day of the series to try luck in the final event in which he came out on-top of the 254 player field to claim his first gold ring along with \$12,701.

Guss didn't have any plans on playing the Circuit as he was in Michigan visiting his parents and his twin brother talked him into making the trip down for the final event.

The final event saw a very tough field and left Guss with around 30,000 with four tables left, but a string of double-ups saw his stack balloon over 250,000 in a matter of three-hands.

Guss sat down at the final table with 275,000 and was to the left of 2016 WSOP bracelet winner Jean "Prince" Gaspard who brought the top stack of 1.2 million. Gaspard and Guss went back-and-forth but ultimately, Guss got the better winning seven out of eight hands that would see Gaspard take his exit in 4th place.

Guss took a sizeable chip advantage into the three-way battle that would last hours before he would reign victorious after eliminating WSOP bracelet winner Frank Maggio.

"This feels amazing," Guss said after his win. "Frank is a truly amazing player and he was very tough to get rid of."
